Q: Why does a chili pepper taste hot to people and other mammals, but not birds?

A: The chili pepper plant evolved over time to be attractive to birds and distasteful to other animals that might look to make it a meal. When a bird eats a chili, the seeds remain intact and pass through the bird's droppings where they are spread over a wide area to grow and multiply, but the digestive tracts of mammals destroy the chili seeds when ingested. So, as a defense mechanism chili plants taste hot to mammals like people, dogs, squirrels, rabbits, etc., while birds cannot taste the heat at all.

Q: Is chili pepper physically harmful to any of my backyard friends?

A: Absolutely not. Scientific tests have proven that the "hot" sensation caused by eating chili peppers is only a temporary sensory stimulation. That means there is no actual or permanent physical damage to the eye, nose, or throat tissues of any bird or animal that eats it. It feels no different from handling peppers while cooking and it makes for a very safe, effective, and humane way to increase the number of bird visits to your feeder while making sure they remain exclusively for the birds.

Q: What can I expect to see at the feeder?

A: Since all "Hot" products are based on taste preferences, they must be eaten for birds to learn it is a delicious new food source and for other animals to discover it is not their favorite flavor. Once you fill your feeder, you will see all kinds of different

visitors, both bird and non-bird, trying it out over the next few weeks. It is important to know that chilies are not repellents. Within a short period of time most mammals simply decide they do not like the taste and move on to other more palatable food sources in your yard, thus freeing up the feeder for your favorite visitors to hang out even longer.

Please note that sometimes it takes a few days to a couple of weeks for your backyard birds to recognize the new hot seed offerings as a viable food source. Most songbirds are very visual and any change to a feeder's look or contents can temporarily confuse them. Once they get past the change and try it out, you will see a significant increase in bird visits and maybe even a few species you've never seen before at your feeder!
